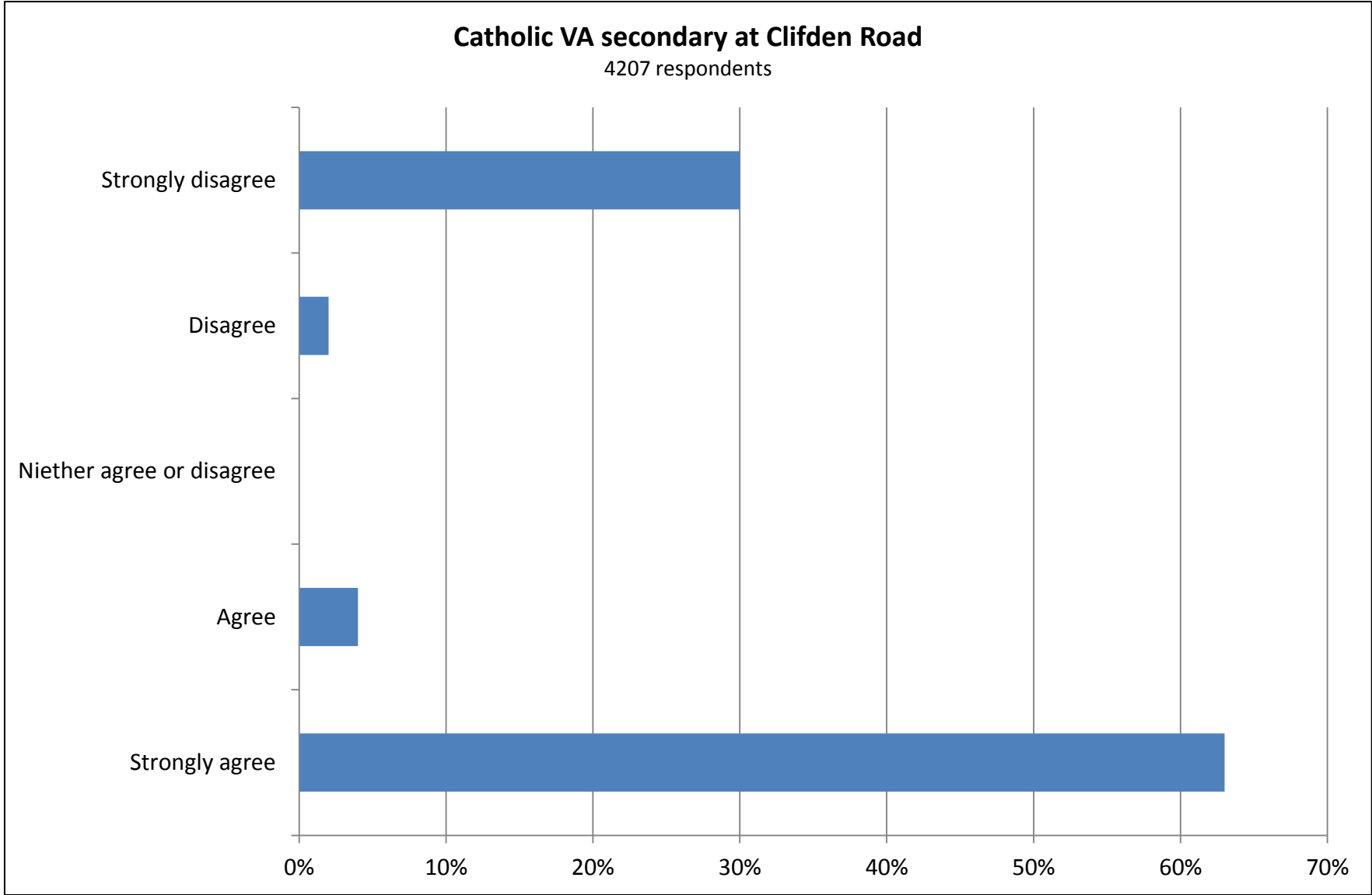

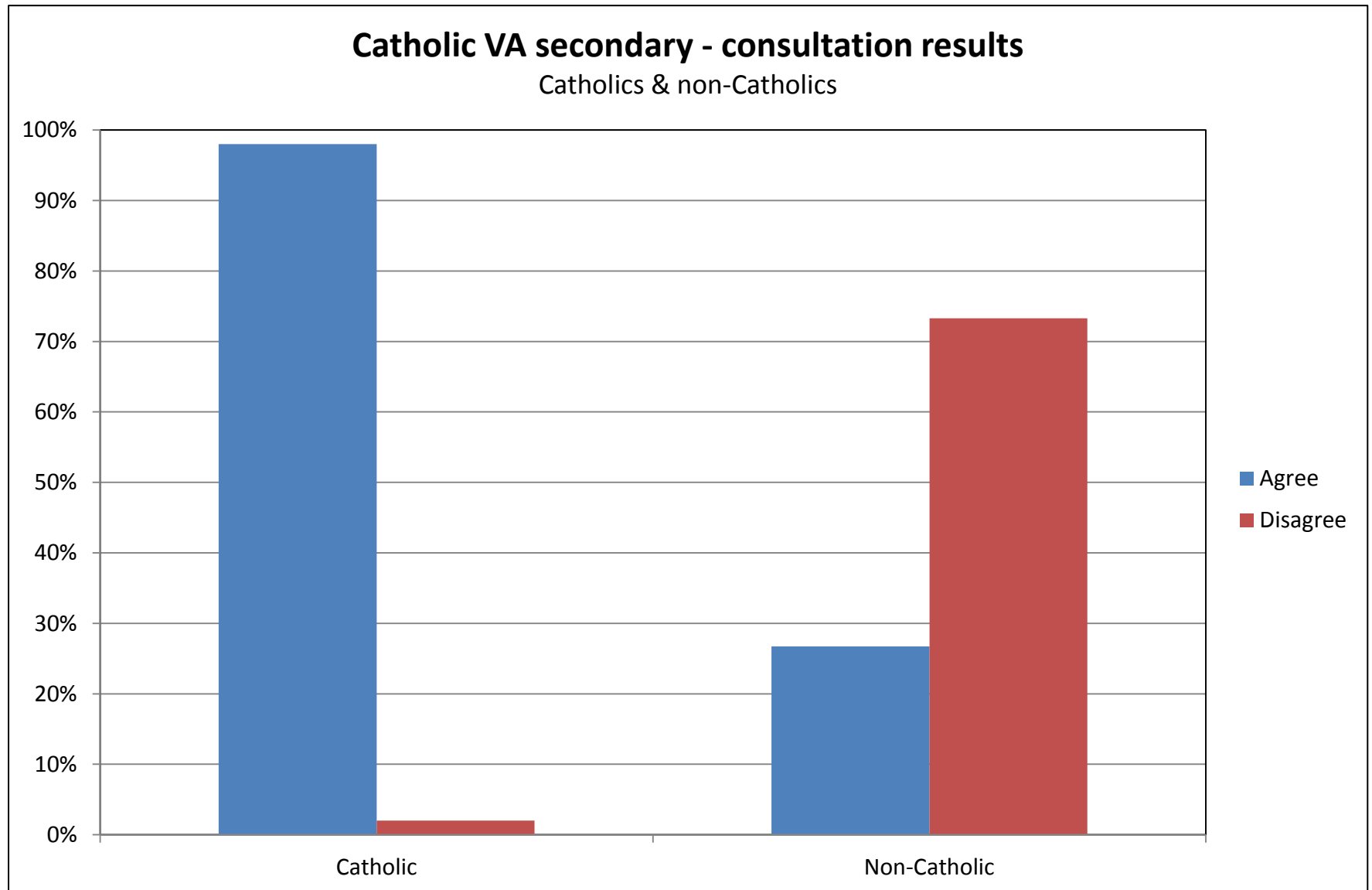

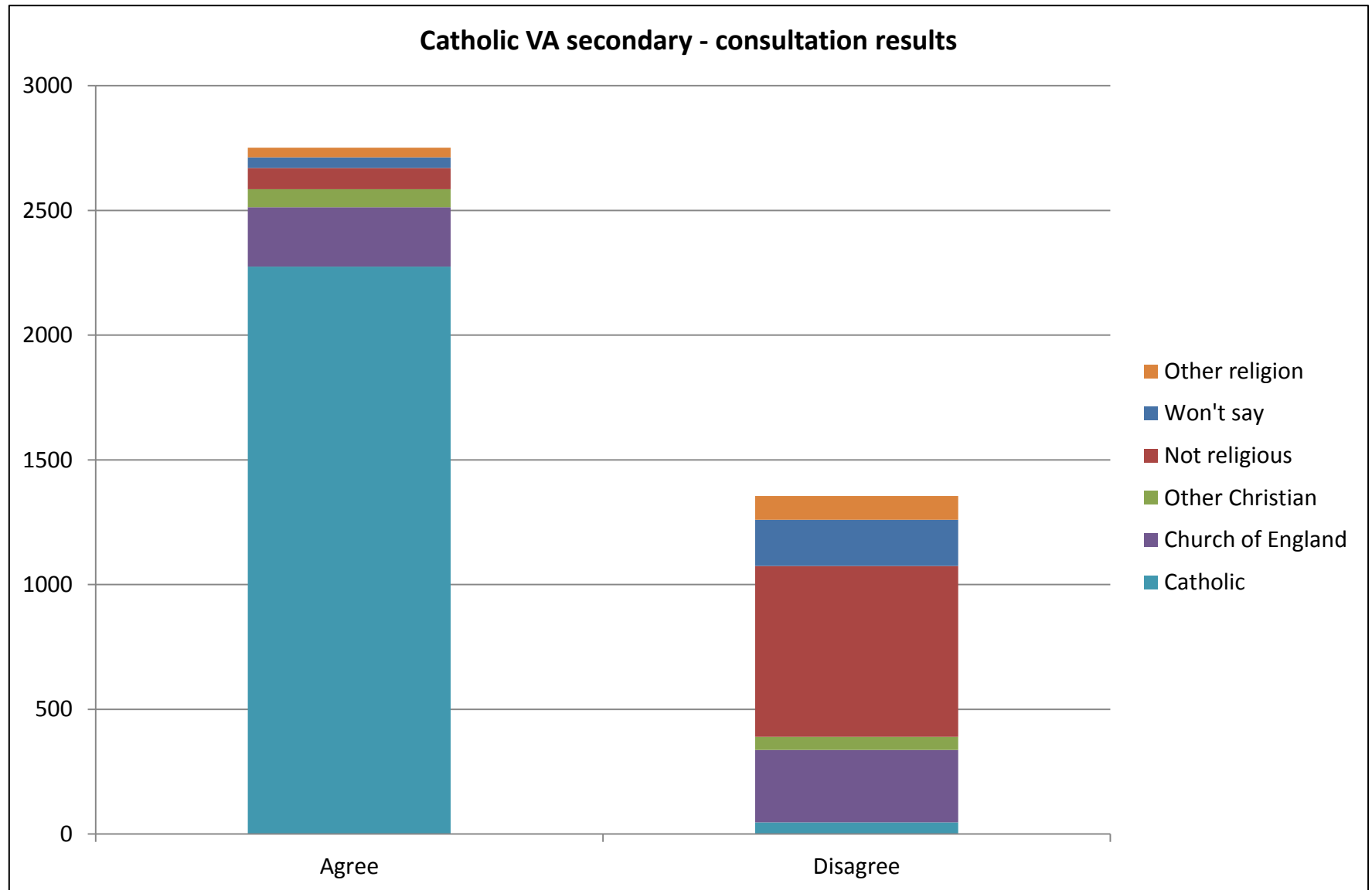
67% of 4207 respondents agreed that a Catholic secondary at Clifden Road is a good idea...



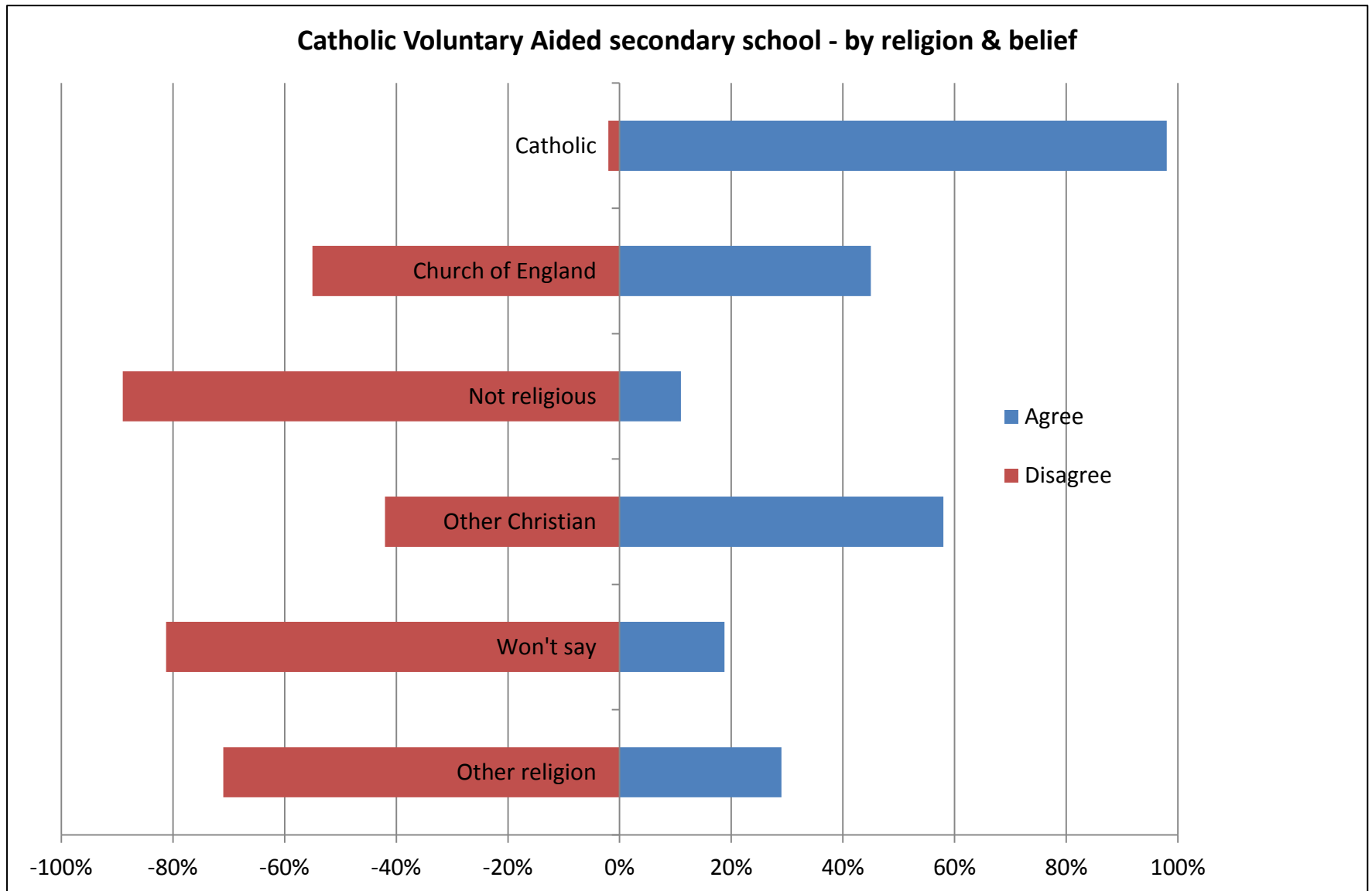
...but that's because most of them were Catholics (98% in favour).
73% of non-Catholics were against, including the majority of Anglicans (55% against)...



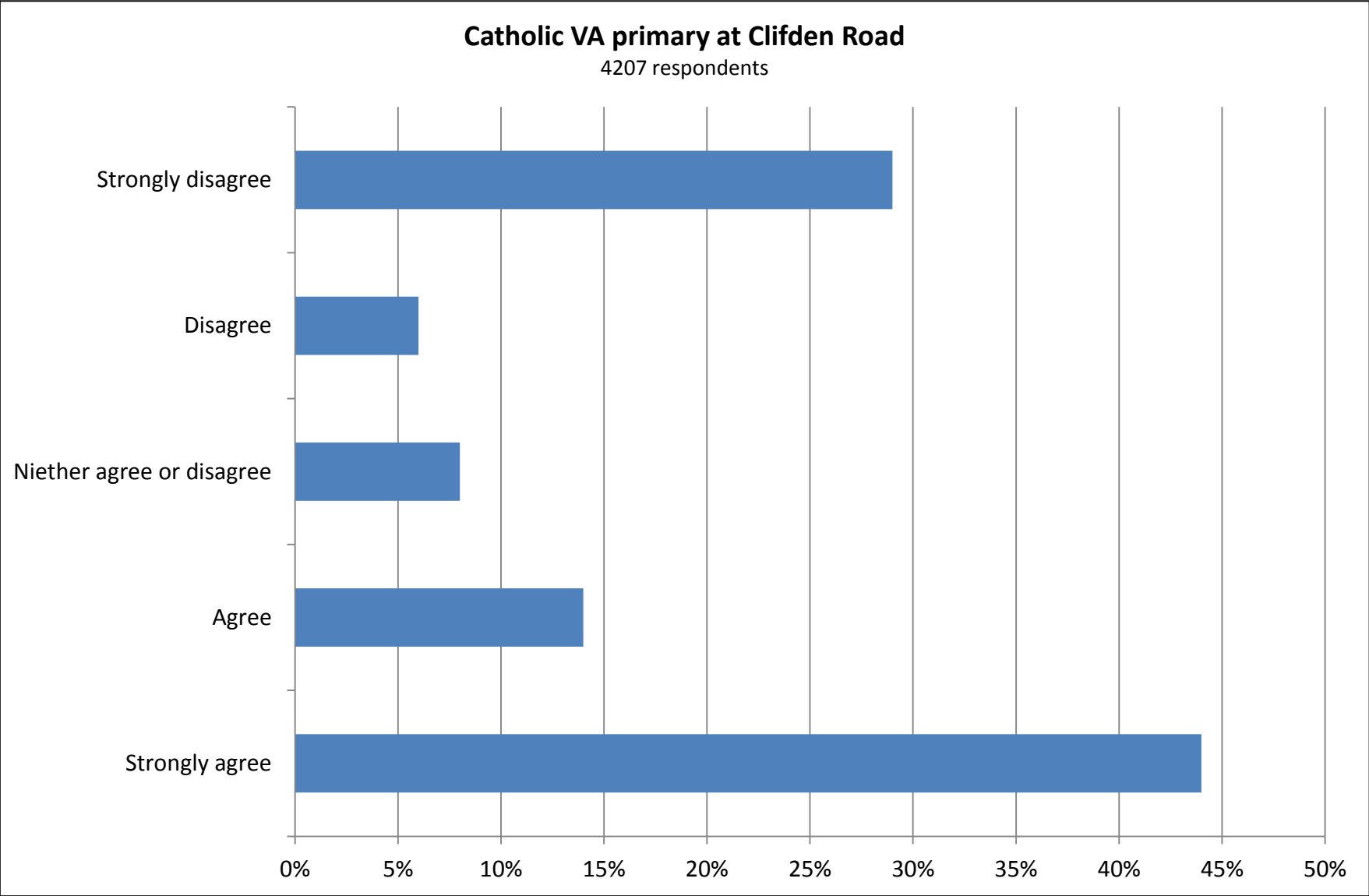
Here's the breakdown by religion & belief...



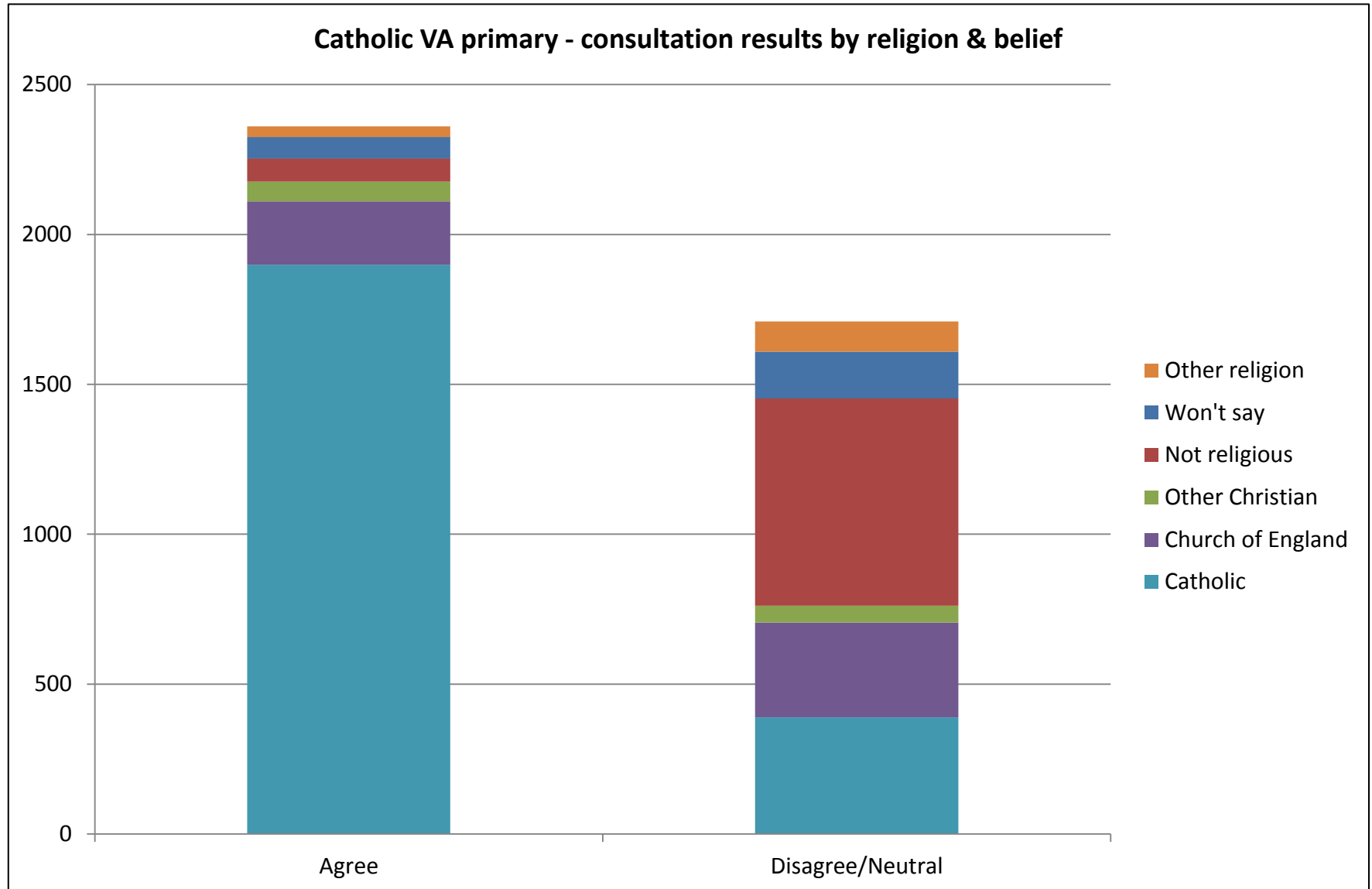
Or to put it another way...



The picture for the proposed one-form primary is similar but less polarised. 58% agree with the proposals, 34% disagree...



Again the Catholic vote dominates. The Council report does not provide enough information to split the “disagree” and “neither agree nor disagree” numbers by religion & belief...



Conclusion:

Catholics want Clifden Road to be used for Catholic schools
